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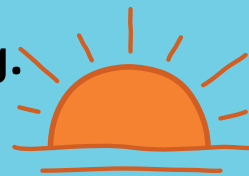
# Birdwatch: How to Do It Right

## 1 Choose calm spots or birdwatching hides.

Birds often come closer when the surroundings are quiet.

## 2 Go birdwatching in the morning or evening.

That's when birds are most active, and you'll have a better chance of spotting them.



## 3 Listen carefully.

You'll often hear birds before you see them. Sound is also key in identifying different species.



## 4 Move quietly and slowly.

Birds have excellent hearing and eyesight. Sudden movements will scare them off.



## 5 Use binoculars and bird identification guides.

They'll help you spot and recognize more species with ease.



## 6 Be patient.

It's one of the most important skills in birdwatching. Like they say: "Good things come to those who wait."

## 7 Learn bird silhouettes.

You can often recognize a bird by its shape or flight pattern

## 8 Visit the same location at different times and seasons.

You'll notice more diversity in bird species this way.
